- Length and level of involvement or commitment of the nominee to her or his act of community service:
- The dedication and courage of the nominee's activism.

The selection committee is comprised of members of the CUPE 3906 executive and members-at-large. Members of the selection committee cannot nominate a candidate. Members of the selection committee who have personal ties with the nominees must yield their place to another member of the Executive or a CUPE member-at-large nominated by the members of the selection committee. This year's Activist Awards will be presented at the Annual General Meeting in April 2011.
