- Authoring and co-authoring manuscripts for publication, as well as other forms of research dissemination
- Supporting the Library's task of seamless integration of information literacy and MIETL's task of evaluating the effective use of technology

Qualifications and Skills:

- PhD in any discipline, though graduate work in Educational Technology or Library Science would be an asset
- Familiarity with the Scholarship of Teaching & Learning specifically as it relates to technology enhanced education and/or previous experience conducting such work

- Familiarity with quantitative and qualitative research methods, with an emphasis on quantitative methods
- Experience teaching in an online environment would be preferred
- Openness to a range of disciplinary approaches to scholarship and inquiry, and ability to work in interdisciplinary contexts
- Strong organizational and project management skills
- Ability to work well both independently and collaboratively
