Caleb: "Yes, two sessions were with the conciliation officer. We've reached agreement on several non-monetary articles, including seniority. Monetary issues like wages are ongoing, but we'll post a detailed bargaining update soon."

11. New Business (PART 1)

To align with the amended agenda, two New Business items (Racial Justice Conference delegate motion and OUWCC Campus Rep motion) were moved before the elections.

a. Racial Justice & Human Rights Conference (Korede/Brad)

Brad: "We shifted this item earlier. I've put the motion language in the chat, though I can't move it. The internal discussion was to send three delegates to the CUPE Ontario Racial Justice Conference on Tuesday, November 25th, in Toronto. Happy to walk through it once it's moved."

Mitch moves it Rishav seconded

Brad: "Budget originally planned for 2 delegates to Racial Justice and 2 to Human Rights (held back-to-back). Registration costs turned out higher than expected (late registration = \$170 each). Total cost for 3 delegates = \$510 of the \$600 budget line. No hotel required (one-day conference).

Local covers per diem + transportation (GO Bus/Train or TTC). Workshops and schedule details were shared."

Kusum: "If you work with equity committees or have QTBIPOC-related research, I encourage you to volunteer to go — it's a great opportunity."

Brad: "This is former item 13E. It needs to come before elections because depending on results, we may not be able to follow it later. I'll turn it to Kyle."

Kyle: "Discloses conflict of interest — he is the current OUWCC Campus Rep. Conference rules require the Rep to be a member of a sending local.

Kusum Supports prioritizing the Campus Rep and raises concerns from last year: need to ensure equity-seeking delegates can access voting badges when necessary.

Proposal for End-of-Term PostdocLunch Gathering

Proposed by: Bita Pourbahari-lead stewardunit 3

Objective:

Organizean end-of-term lunchfor postdocs at Phoenix CraftHouse, providing an opportunity to network, socialize, and strengthen the postdoc community at McMaster University. This will be the first postdoc gathering in over a year, offering a valuable chance for postdocs to connect, as few events specifically bring them together across the university.

Date & Location:

• **Location:** Phoenix Craft House & Grill, McMasterUniversity

• **Time:** 12:00 PM – 2:00 PM

Target Audience: Postdoctoral researchers.

Expected Attendance: Approximately 40 postdocs, ensuring an engaging and interactive environment for networking and socializing.

Menu & Catering Details:

- **Cost per person:** 20 CAD (for a set menu or a selection of platters).
- Total food cost for 40 people: $20 \text{ CAD } \times 40 = 800 \text{ CAD}$
- **Platters:** A selection of platterswill be provided to accommodate various dietary needs (vegetarian, vegan, gluten-free, etc.).

Budget Breakdown:

- **Food cost (30 CAD per person):** 20 x 40 = 800 CAD
- **Tax on food (13%):** 800 CAD x 0.13 = 104 CAD
- Total cost (food + tax): 800 + 104 = 904 CAD
