Over the past 3 years, I've worked as a research and teaching assistant at McMaster, collaborating closely with students, faculty, and staff across my master, and years of training in both psychology and business environments, then we looked at a deeper understanding of communication, empathy, And leadership is skills that I believe are essential for building a strong and inclusive relationships. So, today I'm running for Vice President External, because I want to expand to his connections beyond campus to collaborate with all your labor unions, community organizations, groups that share our goals, our fairness, respect, and improved working conditions.
